What do Salman Rushdie, Emily Dickinson, Soren Kierkegaard, and Henry Thoreau have in common?

Ed Mooney is a Professor of Religion and Philosophy at Syracuse University. Recently his California meditations, *Postcards Dropped in Flight*, came out, and he's working now on *Thoreau's Writing as Religious Philosophy*. Ed Mooney has published three books on the Danish philosopher and literary genius, Soren Kierkegaard, and edited a book on the Thoreauvian philosopher, Henry Bugbee. Mooney has recently written on Stanley Cavell's moral perfectionism and on Cavell's view of criticism as piety; and he's also written on the loss of passion and persons in the humanities.
